WERKMAN HOOFCARE HISTORY



Werkman Hoofcare established in Groningen, was formed in 1909. The founders, the brothers Hero and Berend Werkman, both farriers themselves, strived to provide their customers with excellent service in addition to top-quality horseshoes.

In the past century, Werkman Hoofcare has exported many different models to countries all over the world. Today, the fourth Werkman generation has the reins of the company. Since 2022, the new and state-of-the-art production site in Eemshaven has been occupied.

1915 - CONSTRUCTION OF FACTORY AND RESIDENCE

In 1915 Werkman had a beautiful residence designed by the renowned architectural firm Drewes. Ten years later Werkman again chose this firm (now Kuiler and Drewes) to design a completely new factory.

The residence was thoroughly remodeled in 1957, but retained its elegant appearance. The building in Helpman was sold in 2020, paving the way for a new chapter in Werkman Hoofcare's history: the move to Eemshaven.

1938 - CLIENTS

Orders were placed on pre-printed postcards, and delivery was made by horse and cart or train barge. The company prospered during World War I, when horseshoes were delivered to foreign armies. Until World War II, production increased to 3,000 pieces per day with 10 employees. At that time, heavy horseshoes were made for working horses. In 1938, Mr. A. Werkman joined his father's company.

HORSESHOES

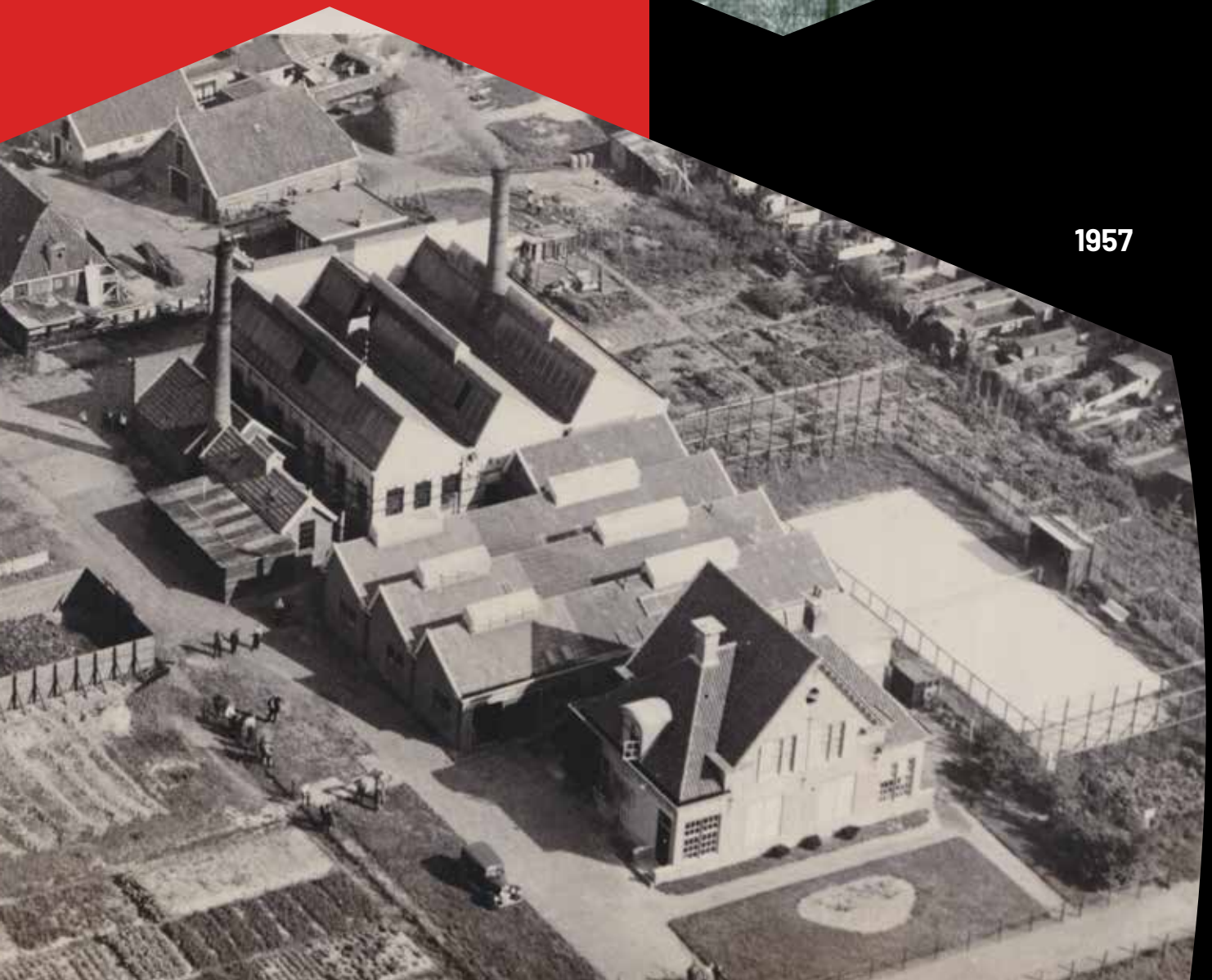
The brothers Hero and Berend Werkman were blacksmiths working in Ezinge. They began the industrial production of horseshoes in Helpman, which formerly belonged to Haren. Making horseshoes by hand was heavy and time-consuming work. It took much persuasion to convince blacksmiths that factory-made horseshoes could be just as good as hand-forged ones.

During World War II it was difficult to keep the factory running because of the scarcity of steel. Raw materials remained scarce until the 1950s, resulting in limited customer deliveries.

In the 1950s, Hoefijzerfabriek Werkman began supplying German agencies for markets in Cuba and Porto Rico. Army and police were also important customers. When the rise of the tractor displaced the workhorse from agriculture, a challenging period began for the six horseshoe factories in the Netherlands. Ireland became an important export market around 1965, but that too disappeared in the 1970s.

Thus Hoefijzerfabriek Werkman became an export company. Sales grew again and the horseshoe models were adapted to the needs of foreign blacksmiths. The market later expanded even further, so Werkman Hoofcare began to sell its horseshoes worldwide.

1998 - FACTORY EXPANSION

Production was expanded by mechanizing the manufacturing process, eliminating much manual work. The bar cutter with a conveyor belt and furnace with walking beam replaced the cutting of strips into trays and sliding them manually through the furnace. Initially the furnaces were fired with coke and coal, later switching to oil and since the discovery of natural

gas in Slochteren this has become the source of energy. Punching and cutting were done separately and machines came along that combined these processes. Horseshoes used to be strung in bunches of 20 with iron wire, but this was replaced by boxing.

2009 - 100TH ANNIVERSARY

In 2009 the 100th anniversary of Werkman Hoofcare was celebrated in a big way through a 3-day party. This party was also the beginning of "the Spring Games" which is held every two years. This has grown into the largest farrier festival in the world.

2021-2023 - RELOCATION TO EEMSHAVEN

In 2021, the formal move to Eemshaven began. Here Werkman Hoofcare purchased the premises on Borkumweg, thoroughly remodeled and expanded by 500 m². This has resulted in the most modern horseshoe factory in the world, thanks in part to our unique induction heating production of horseshoes on a large scale.

The move was formally completed in February 2023, after Hammer 8 was the last to be assembled and made ready for production. This was a project that the entire team worked hard, with blood, sweat and tears, to bring it to a successful conclusion. We are now ready for the future!

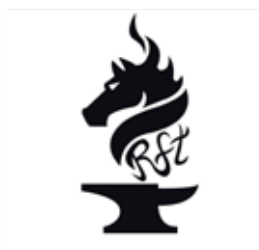

DR. SIMON CURTIS

(United Kingdom)

TOPIC

"THE DISTAL PHALANX: IT'S A FUNNY OLD BONE"

Dr. Simon Curtis was a practicing farrier in Newmarket, England for 48 years. He has lectured and demonstrated farriery in more than 30 countries on 6 continents including the USA, Australia, India, Russia, and Brazil. He has published 4 text books on farriery and has been published in numerous journals. He was awarded an Honorary Associate of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (2002). The first time that any farrier has received this honour.

Simon is a Fellow of the Worshipful Company of Farriers by examination (FWCF) and was awarded an Honorary Associateship of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (HonAssocRCVS) in 2002. In 2005 he was inducted into the International Farriers Hall of Fame at the Kentucky Derby Museum, USA. Simon gained a BSc. (Hons) in Farriery, University of Central Lancashire in 2011 and in 2017 a Doctoral degree in equine biomechanics and physiology. His thesis was The effect of weight-bearing and loading upon hoof shape of Thoroughbred foals.

He was awarded an Honorary Fellowship of Myerscough College in 2017 and in 2018 the Sir Colin Spedding Award by the National Equine Forum. Dr Simon Curtis continues to broadcast webinars, The Hoof of the Horse podcasts, tutor farriers, write and lecture.



MONIQUE CRAIG

(United States)

TOPIC

HOW DOES THE INNATE ASYMMETRY OF THE BONES OF THE LOWER LIMB AFFECT TRIMMING & SHOE PLACEMENT?

Monique Craig has a degree in computer science engineering with a minor in mathematics and physics. She was aiming at a PhD in computational linguistics at Stanford, when she purchased her Holsteiner stallion – Smirnoff. His chronic hoof problems made her take a very different direction in her career. She became a professional farrier and concurrently developed the software Metron with her husband John Craig. A few years later she invented the EponaShoe.

Monique has spent many years researching, trimming and shoeing the hoof – as well as riding and training. Her research has been presented at several veterinary and farrier conferences and in various publications. She recently published a book: "A Modern Look at... The Hoof". She gives lectures in the USA and internationally. She has been a visiting scholar at CalPoly San Luis Obispo for the past fifteen years where she lectures in a biomechanics course for pre-veterinarian students.

PROF. DR. JENNY HAGEN

(Germany)

REHABILITATION OF HORSES WITH TENDON INJURIES FROM AN ORTHOPAEDIC AND FUNCTIONAL POINT OF VIEW.

UNEVEN FEET-CAUSES, EFFECT AND CASE MANAGEMENT

Dr. Jenny Hagen is a veterinarian, associated professor and farrier specialized on equine orthopedics, rehabilitation and training. After her study of veterinary medicine, she did her doctoral thesis and post-doc thesis at the Leipzig University, where she established the research group "Equine biomechanics and orthopedics".

From 2011 to these days, she and her group examined several practical relevant topics about the effect of trimming and shoeing on the biomechanics of the distal limb and the equine gait pattern. 2003 to 2018 Jenny also did her farrier education and was employed at the farrier school at the Leipzig University.

The last years, she did several specializations in different manual therapy techniques, gait analysis and rehabilitation training of horses. Since 2020, Jenny is self-employed in her practice for equine orthopedics and rehabilitation in the middle of Germany.



JOHN CRAIG

(United States)

TOPIC

INTERMEDIATE AND NOVICE CLASSTOPIC 1: ASSESSING MEDIOAL-LATERAL BALANCE FROM RADIOGRAPHS

John Craig has a Phd from Stanford in engineering. He is the author of "Introduction to Robotics: Mechanics & Control" which is a leading university textbook for the engineering field of robotics.

He has authored several papers related to robotics as well as equine biomechanics, and has chaired conference sessions on biomechanics and the connection between machines and the biomechanics of animals. He has researched the hoof and shoeing systems for the past 20 years, and has been a speaker at the International Hoof Summit in Cincinnati, and other veterinary/farrier venues.

He is the lead software developer for the Metron Imaging system used for digital radiography and other modalities in veterinary imaging. For the past 8 years he has been focused on using artificial intelligence to automate the understanding of veterinary images.

One of the many travels of his career led him to Rob Sigafoos in the USA, which resulted in him not only being involved in the further development of glued shoes, but also becoming an expert in the field long before gluing was in general use. Simon is internationally renowned for his critical view of current hoofcare concepts and for his extensive experience in various areas of working with lame horses. In his two lectures he will explain how to shoe for optimum hoof health vs shoeing for optimum limb health.

Simon Moore was born into a circus family in 1971, where his father was a lion tamer. Deciding not to follow his father's career, he started his farriery apprenticeship with Paul Atkins RSS in 1989 and passed the Diploma of the Worshipful Company of Farriers (Dip WCF) in 1993. After finishing his apprenticeship, he set up business in Essex where he primarily shod sports horses, with a particular interest in shoeing showjumpers. During this time Simon would meet his future wife Ruth and they married in 1996 and have four children. In 1998 they relocated to Cornwall for 'a slower pace of life' but farriery soon took centre stage. In 2003 he established Cornwall's first farriery practice Equine Foot Care, in partnership with Paul Martin Dip WCF, concentrating mainly on training apprentices. During this time, he was directly responsible for training 6 apprentices, of which four have successfully passed the AWCF exam, one of those being his son Callum. An achievement he is particularly proud of.

In 2011 he passed the Associate of the Worshipful Company of Farriers (AWCF) and then passed the Fellowship of the Worshipful Company of Farriers (FWCF) in 2016. He was appointed to the Worshipful company of Farriers examination board in 2016 and continues to be an active member. He is a proud father and grandfather and spends his leisure time with his family or cycling the Cornish countryside. He is regular tutor and clinician.



FLORIAN HAEFNER

(Germany)

TOPIC

BREAKOVER, SUPPORT AND OTHER MYTHS-SHOEING THE MODERN SPORT HORSE

Born 1980 in Heilbronn/Germany, Florian Häfner started a career in the equine industry in 1998, working for different farriers and horse trainers. 2006, after his graduation as state certified farrier, he started a farrier and horse training business in Weinsberg/Germany.

In 2009 he joined Werkman Horseshoes in Groningen/Netherlands. At Werkman he was first responsible for sales in central Europe and then became the head of the research & development department. In the following years he was involved in scientific studies about the effect of orthopaedic horseshoes, co-authoring several research publications and developing related products such as the Orthokit® or horseshoes as the Werkman Warrior Ice.

Since 2017 Florian Häfner is the owner and editor of Farriersjournal UG. 2018 the company was relocated from Belgium to Germany. By 2024 he still continuously shoeing horses for one day a week. He is father of one son and spends the non-working time with his family training dogs and horses.

FWCF Henrik Jansson is one of only three Fellows of the Worshipful Company of Farriers from the European continent. The title of Fellow is internationally recognised as the most difficult examination in farriery and is currently held by only about 200 farriers worldwide.

Henrik has been working as a senior clinical farrier and researcher for the University of Uppsala/Sweden for many years. At the Spring games 2025 he will talk about different injuries which can occur to the coffin bone and explain how to treat them.

Hi, I'm Jamey Carsel CJF from the Ozark Mountains, Missouri. My passion for horses began early—I rode, hunted wild boar, and competed in rodeo, eventually focusing on steer wrestling. I became a horse trainer, then a farrier in 1991, developing a deep love for the craft. Over the years, I built a thriving business shoeing warmbloods and quarter horses, competed in farrier contests, and mentored many. As a resident farrier at Iowa State University, I trained vet students and started the first farrier school in Iowa.

Now, I serve as a clinician and team farrier with Werkman Hoofcare USA. I also helped design the Maverick and Rodeo horseshoe lines to improve shoeing for quarter horses. BERNI PRINS

(The Netherlands)

*BREAKOVER, SUPPORT AND OTHER MYTHS-
SHOEING THE MODERN SPORT HORSE*

Berni Prins is a qualified farrier, which means he obtained his diploma (2002) for full training as an independent farrier at the Nederlandse Hippische Beroepsopleidingen in Deurne.

In 2015, Berni Prins joined the board of the Dutch Association of Farriers. In addition to his role as vice-chairman, he is involved in education. In this role, he works with other stakeholders on the content and examination requirements of the European-recognised farrier training and is the contact point for schools, placement providers and the examination board.

The NOK&H Foundation, of which he is chairman, is a peer review group of farriers attached to equine clinics who have specialised in orthopaedic hoof care. This intervention group aims to establish and describe quality guidelines for regular and orthopaedic hoof care. These guidelines serve as a basis for promoting the quality of hoof care in the Netherlands.

Currently, Berni Prins works as an itinerant farrier where he visits clients at home. His work as an itinerant farrier mainly consists of assisting (large) sporting stables. His work is diverse: trimming, regular and sport shoeing, cutting out hoof ulcers, position corrections in foals, (light) orthopaedic hoofcare. Berni Prins also runs his own farriery in Bears next to Arts&Dier's horse clinic. Here he works as an orthopaedic farrier on Monday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons. On the premises, horses can be monitored on hard and soft surfaces, this allows for a good analysis of movements. At the farrier, he therefore mainly receives clients with horses that have orthopaedic hoof care. Examples include: treatments for lameness, uneven feet, laminitis, straal cancer and other hoof diseases, tendon problems, horn columns and more.
